Q6. Are there too many overall state credit requirements (46 credits) for graduation?

Q7. Are there too many overall state core academic credit requirements (29 credits) for graduation?

Q8. Do your local graduation requirements exceed the state minimums?

Q9. Is it difficult for your LEA to satisfy the minimum state graduation requirements?

Q10. Are the current state minimum graduation requirements meaningful to your high school students?

Q11. Do the state's current minimum graduation requirements help your high school students achieve their goals after graduation (e.g., college or university, military, mission, or straight into a career)?

Q12. Please provide some clear examples, connecting the current requirements with meeting or not meeting your high school students' goals after graduation.

Q13. Please estimate how many of your students (percentage-wise) pursue the following options immediately after graduation. Note: Numbers in columns should add up to 100%.

Q14. Would offering defined, localized pathways toward graduation (through required elective credits) be a challenge or have significant barriers for implementation at your school district or charter school? This might include college-readiness, industry apprenticeships, CTE pathways, military etc. Localized pathways are defined course progressions that clearly illustrate the opportunities available at your school or through your school's community partners. EXAMPLE: Which courses, offered by your school or community partners, should a student take if they intend to go to college, to the military, straight to the workforce, etc.
